Reading: Acts chapter 2

Dear Parishioners,

Take a moment to read Acts chapter 2. Easter has come and gone but the good news is Christ Jesus is with us for evermore! In the church's calendar we are in the period of waiting, 50 days to be exact, between the Resurrection and Pentecost. During this period Christ appeared many times to His followers, on one occasion to at least 500 of them. Christ instructed His disciples to wait in Jerusalem until they had received the promised gift of the Holy Spirit. This promise was made to the disciples in John chapter 14 and fulfilled in Acts chapter 2. How sad it is today that Acts 2 often causes conflict and division amongst the followers of Christ. Yet, if you read the text of Acts 2 closely, you will see that it was, in fact, the day of bringing divided and dispersed people together. In fact it is the reversal of the curse of the Tower of Babel in Genesis chapter 11. In Genesis chapter 11 God confounded the language of man so that they could not understand one another. On the day of Pentecost God, through the work of the Holy Spirit, enabled all men (from very diverse places and of different languages) to understand the gospel in their mother tongue. If you follow the story of Pentecost you will see that the preaching of the gospel by Peter resulted in 3000 people coming to saving faith in Christ. Imagine a congregation 100 times of that which meets each Sunday morning at Holy Trinity coming to faith in Christ in one day. Amazing!!

Yet, one of the most significant parts of the story is actually the faithfulness of the disciples to obey Christ's command and to wait in Jerusalem. If they had not waited the fifty days, as instructed, they would not have been in Jerusalem to receive 'power from on high' I want to challenge all of us to use the period between Easter Day and Pentecost (which, this year, is on May 23rd) as a time for waiting and preparation for God to renew and refresh us by His Holy Spirit. I want to encourage you to be faithful and to wait before God each day in prayer and bible study – that, as individuals and as a church, we might again be empowered from on high to bring the good news (the gospel) of Jesus Christ to others. I also want to challenge you to think of how we, as individuals and as a church, need to bring the gospel (which does not change) in a fresh way to a Carrickfergus that has many different languages – English, Eastern European, Asian etc, - OAP's: baby boomers; youth culture; post-modern culture etc. – to think and pray about how we reach these and other groups so that they hear the gospel in their language and come to saving faith in Christ. Is that not what we are supposed to be about?

A TIME FOR PRAYER and REFLECTION

On Wednesday May 5th we will have the opportunity, as a congregation, to pray together for the work of Holy Trinity Church, both inside the building and within the community. Please come along, any time between 7.30 and 9pm to offer your prayers to God. If you have never attended these prayer evenings please make a special effort this time and please don't be put off by thinking you have to pray out loud as that is not the case. If prayers are asked in faith, quietly or out loud, God will hear them.

On Tuesday June 1st the Bishop of Connor; the Rev Bill Boyce of St. Brigid's, Mallusk; his curate the Rev Andrew Kerr and St. Brigid's parishioner Sam Cunningham will set out on a 346 mile cycle ride visiting every parish in the diocese over the following six days.

The Bishop and his fellow cyclists will be calling at Holy Trinity on Sunday June 6th approx. 2pm – everyone is welcome to be there to meet and greet them.
