## **Letter to Parishioners**

Readings: Isaiah 50.4 & Isaiah 42.3



Dear Friends, please take a moment and read Isaiah 50.4 and then Isaiah 42.3.

When Christ Jesus lived amongst us He had, as Isaiah says, "a learned tongues..." We often

read of Jesus encountering people who were weary, downtrodden, despised, rejected and forgotten the society of the day. In each encounter He has words that refresh their souls, soothe their aching hearts and brings peace that is beyond human comprehension. On occasions we read of Him being hassled and harassed by venomous religious leaders and He always found the right words to say to expose their false understanding of God and the misapplication of God's Word. Surrounded by people who were physically and emotionally weary by all that life threw at them, the Lord Jesus sustained them with words that still are heard to this day all around the world. But where did He learn such words?

Take a moment now and read John 8 verse 28 and verse 40. These two verses give us the answer. His Father taught Him how to speak and what words were appropriate to bring comfort, forgiveness, healing, restoration and reconciliation. To speak such words takes a special skill. To speak the right words at the right moment takes insight in to people. To know when not to speak, such as the incident of the women caught in adultery, where Jesus knelt down and started to write in the dust, is an amazing gift of discernment. All these Christ learned from His Father's instruction - as per the verses in John 8.

Even as He was dying on the cross of Calvary, for the sins of the world, Christ spoke words of comfort and salvation to a dying thief.

In our day and generation, we have the inspired Word of God. The promises in that Word are new every morning. The principles which it teaches are timeless. Its insights are relevant in every area of our lives and of our world. The comfort it brings sustains the wary, heals the broken, awakens the sloth and brings salvation to all who would believe.

However, it needs passed on, it needs to be communicated to people. It is not to be read, studied, learned, as an end in itself. We must pass on the Word in a timely, sensitive way, to sustain the weary people all around us. If a doctor has the answer to a disease, would it not be a crime if he sat in his study further analysing that answer, and did not pass it on to those who are suffering? Some weary person needs a word from you today. Someone lost in sin needs to hear of the forgiveness that Christ alone can bring. Someone beaten down by the cares of life needs to hear God's restoring promises. How will they hear if you do not share the Word of God with them?

Do not fail to pass on what God has taught you from His Word.
