A Bible in their hands A Saviour in their hearts A Purpose in their lives

Reading: Jeremiah 8 verse 20



Dear Friends,

October is often the month of Harvest Celebrations in churches throughout the land. As a people we live further and further away from the source of our food. Despite farmer's markets etc most of our food comes pre-washed

and pre-packaged. Added, millions of tonnes is discarded every year because of being the wrong shape, colour or size. It is quite shocking to think of this happening, but it does. Think for a moment of when you go shopping, especially for fruit and vegetables. Do you really know by the shape or colour or size if an apple is good or bad? Or any other fruit or vegetable for that matter? The truth is we do not have a clue and are trusting someone else to grade, select and present fruit and vegetables for us. We want it conveniently packaged so we can take it home without much thought.

The verse above mentions how the summer has ended, as it just has, and the harvest is over and yet the people of Judah are not "saved." It is quite a stark statement by Jeremiah. Another season has past, another year in fact, and the people have remained in their idolatry and sin. The people have wandered far from God and in demonstration of this they would have indulged in all sorts of fertility rites of the pagan gods in the lead up to harvest, praying to dumb idols for a good harvest. Jeremiah is God's voice calling them to repent and warning them that another harvest has come and gone and they are still in rebellion against God. Their barns and grain stores are full but their lives are empty and barren.

How dreadful to find yourself in such a position? You have all you need for your material needs but spiritually you are a wasteland. The harvest is completed. You may even be well pleased with the results, but your life is empty and your soul is lost. Jesus picks this theme up in the New Testament in Luke 12 when He tells the story of the man who had a bumper harvest and tore down his barns to build bigger barns. The man

decided to sit back, relax and enjoy life but Christ said he was a fool because that very night his soul was called to account before the judgement seat of God. Jeremiah is uttering the same warning in verse 20.

What about you? What about your soul as another season turns and we prepare to celebrate harvest once again? Will another harvest pass without you being right with God in Christ Jesus? Will verse 20 speak of your condition this October? Another summer ended, another harvest over and yet you remain dead in your sins, alienated from God, separated from Him and object of His wrath? Why would you remain in such a state? Why would you remain alienated and separated from God? Why would you continue to live under God's condemnation when the free gift of salvation is offered to you?

Christ offers to you the forgiveness of sins and the salvation of your soul. This harvest receive the most wonderful gift - salvation and know the fruit of the Holy Spirit in your life. What a harvest celebration this could be for you. Take a moment now and read Jeremiah 8 verse 20 and ask yourself: Does this apply to me? Is this verse true of me? If it is true for you - what are you going to do about it?

If you have already received the gift of salvation and you know and love Christ as your Lord and Saviour then rejoice and give thanks for His grace and mercy to you. Further, take verse 20 as a challenge to reach out to those in your family and in your sphere of influence who are still without Christ. A good way to start is to invite them to our harvest service.

Stand By Me

Dear Holy Trinity, Carrickfergus,

Every child deserves a safe and comfortable home. But two years ago, our Agape Home in Myanmar was flooded as a result of heavy rain and our 37 children were forced to evacuate during the night by canoe to the refuge of temporary accommodation. This was a scary and traumatic experience as our kids witnessed their home fill with water, damaging their beds and belongings.





Born in 2023 in a small village, Rebecca's life took a tragic turn at just one month old when her mother fell seriously ill and her father disappeared. With her mother in such bad health and no one eise to care for her, the local church stepped in, provided medical care for her mum and approached the Agape Home to care for Rebecca temporarily. From the moment she arrived, she was showered with love, care and attention and welcomed wholeheartedly.

Unfortunately, after her mum regained health, she was not willing to take Rebecca back and so she became

the youngest member of the Agape family, entrusted to us by God. The home is a place of belonging for Rebecca, filling her life with love and stability where she can grow and develop into the remarkable individual she was created to be. Rebecca is now two years old and has learned to walk and explore her surroundings, and she continues to bring so much joy to the home.

To ensure Rebecca and her siblings can always feel secure and protected in their home, we hope to start building the new home as soon as the monsoon rains finish in October. Every £1 you donate is worth £2 and so any donation you give will go twice as far.

In the midst of the turmoil of the civil war and the crisis of the earthquake, we want to provide our children with the safe haven they deserve. If you're able to give, your donation will be matched and will ensure a loving family home for our Agape family, showing them the care and love of God.
