Letter to Parishioners

John 1 verses 1-14



Dear friends,

If you were given the task of writing the Christmas story where would you begin? Which one of the four gospels would you say begins at the beginning? Well it is certainly not Mark – he begins with Jesus' public ministry.

Matthew and Luke begin with Jesus' birth – so they are a good reference point. But best of all is John, in my humble opinion, because he begins at the beginning. He begins with the pre-existent Jesus, the second person of the Trinity. Before we look at chapter 1 verses 1-14 turn with me to the end of John's gospel. Here we read of the purpose of John writing his gospel. Look at chapter 20 verses 30-31. So John says he wrote his gospel that we might have enough knowledge of Jesus Christ in order that we might be saved from our sins and given the gift of eternal life. In the next chapter, 21v25, John tells us further that he has not recorded everything Jesus did or said because there just would not be the room to do so. So John tells us that the purpose of his gospel is that we might be saved – now he tells us that at the end of his gospel but at the beginning of his gospel he spells out for us the means of salvation, the plan of God to bring that about and the One who is the Saviour. So turn back with me to chapter 1.

John spends the first 14 verses of his gospel spelling out the salvation plan of God the Father for sinful man.

God's strong desire to communicate with us.

Read *verses 1-3*. John tells us that the Word (who in verse 14 is made flesh), was with God and was God prior to creation. In fact this Word, which became flesh, created the world in which you and I now live. Not

only did He create it but He also sustains it. You see loves desire is always to create. God created the world as an expression of His love.

Verses 4-5 John tells us that the Word is the source of light and life of all men. What he is saying is this – you are without excuse this night before God because God has placed enough knowledge in our souls and our minds and in the created order for us to know that He exists. In fact if He did not exist we could not exist. He has illuminated our hearts and souls with a deep longing for Him.

Verses 6-9 John here introduces John the Baptist whose task is to be a forerunner, a messenger, one who prepares the way for the coming of the Word made flesh. John points out to us that John the Baptist is not the Word, in fact he will now fade into the background as the true light of the world's light grows brighter.

Verses 10-11 We read here at the beginning of the gospel some exciting words and yet words tinged with great sadness. The world in which we now live is under the darkness of sin. John will make great use of light and darkness in his gospel (i.e. John 3). Just as this evening the darkness of this church is broken by the light of the candles and the electric lights so the darkness of our world is broken by the light of Christ. John tells us that the world has neither understood nor overcome the light of the world. That is good news for us and yet it is also sad news. Good because Christ is not defeated, his light is not extinguished but sad news because we are part of the world that does not know or understand why he came or who he is. Then comes I think some of the saddest words in these wonderful verses. The Word came to his own and his own received him not. How sad is that? I do not think there is anything sadder, more heartbreaking than a family turning their back on a family member – who had done no wrong, no sin had he committed. Jesus came to his own people, the people of God, the ones who were awaiting his coming and they failed to understand and rejected him. But dear friends can I say to you – He comes to us this night and how many still fail to understand? He comes to us this

night and How many still reject Him? For how many even here this evening has Jesus come and yet you do not receive Him? It is a heartbreaking thing to watch someone hear, see, and know the truth about Jesus Christ and yet not receive Him.

But let us not despair John says some wonderful words next:

Verses 12-13 READ. These are beautiful words. To those who understood, to those who received and accepted Him he gave them sonship. That is he adopted them by grace into His family. Once they were orphans in the world due to their sin, now they are co-heirs with Christ because He has conferred on them the right to be called the children of God. Friends – the greatest Christmas gift, the truth of the gospel is in those words. There was a time when we were no one, when we were orphans, when we were lost and helpless in our sin but now through faith in the Word made flesh we have been adopted by grace and become the children of God. How?

Verse 14 – here is one of the most profound theological statements ever written. John says that the Word, God, the Creator, the one who breathes life and light into the souls of men, the one who brings sonship and adoption into being – came to live amongst us. John deliberately uses the word ‘sarx’ meaning flesh. He says the Word became flesh (that is became human like us, except for sin) and dwelt amongst us – that is pitched his tent amongst us.

God meets us where we are. That is the great news of Christmas. God did not remain aloof, beyond us. He did not abandon us in our sin. He did not wash his hands of us and say: ‘good riddance.’ No, He became like one of us in order that he might save us from our sins and give us eternal life. Joan Osborne sang a song which has the following lines:

*If God had a name, what would it be?
And would you call it to his face,
If you were faced with him in all his glory?*

***What would you ask if you had just one question?
What if God was one of us?***

Friends his name is Jesus Christ. If he stood here now in all his risen glory we would fall at his feet in humble adoration and worship him with all that we had. What would I ask him – why do you love me so, unworthy as I am?

God became one of us in Christ Jesus in order that we might know the extent of his great love for us. He became one of us in order that we might know forgiveness of our sins. He became one of us in order that we might become his sons and his daughters. He became one of us so that we might know the joy of being in love with him and the joy of Him loving us. Brothers and sisters in Christ – he became flesh that we might know love, that we might know what it is to be loved, that we might know that we are his beloved children. John said I have written these things that you might know that Jesus is the Christ and in knowing him know eternal life. Brothers and sisters – this Christmas welcome the Word made flesh, open your heart to the light of the world, open your life to the life he brings, open your soul to the forgiveness only he can bring. This Christmas offer him all you have, offer him all the pain and know his healing. Offer him all your praise and worship and know his blessing. This Christmas know God loves you, you are loved by him, you are his beloved, you are of great worth and value to him. How do I know this? ***READ John 1v14 and then 3v16.*** As we sing – Love came down at Christmas – may He fall afresh on us this Christmas and may we fall deeper in love with him.

Warm Christian greetings to you! I want to thank you, your Select Vestry, and your parish for the prayerful and financial support given to SAMS Ireland during the past year. Your continued commitment enables us to help the Church in South America to grow deeper and stronger. It helps resource and equip leaders in a variety of ways. Your support is really valued and your prayerful and financial commitment plays a key role in these Gospel initiatives. THANK YOU. This past year, SAMS Ireland has had to check and adjust to the altered environment that Covid-19 has created. Restrictions in travel continue to affect the longterm relationships that have developed with local church mission partners in South America. We are grateful for technology such as Zoom which helps to provide for a degree of relationship through this transitional period out of the pandemic. We were delighted to make a new appointment of Mission Development Officer. Former Mission Partner from Paraguay, Claire Holmes, has taken up this part-time post. Her mission experience is proving invaluable as she plans ways in which to engage the local church in Ireland with partners in South America. Please look out for her 'Connected' videos on Facebook and YouTube. Other seasonal resources will follow. SAMS Ireland also continues to play a role in developing mission through local anglican churches through its membership off, and participation in, the 'Association of Mission Societies' (AMS). An excellent opportunity to appear on RTE 1 in May this year was as a result of cooperation between AMS and the Church of Ireland Council for Mission. The SAMS Ireland Covid response fund called 'Isaiah 12.4' project has contributed to helping those lives adversely affected by the pandemic. Mental health improvement, new skill development and overcoming youth isolation are some of the ways in which our partners have been at work helping others through the local church.

There continues to be an ongoing need for theological education, discipling development and church expansion tools. Again thank you and please convey our sincere thanks to your Select Vestry and Parish for your support.
