Letter to Parishioners

Reading: John 1 verses 1-5



relationship to God.

Dear Friends,

This gospel is the familiar reading at the end of the Nine Lessons and Carols. It is known as the Christmas Gospel. John in this opening prologue to his Gospel says three crucial things about Jesus, the Word, in terms of His

First, he is beyond all time. Lots of stories begin "Once upon a time..." but John 1 begins "Once before time..." This echoes very much the opening verses of Genesis in the beginning of Creation, but here we read of God, the Word, before Creation took place. Here is an important first lesson from this text. Jesus does not belong to the created order. He was with the Father before time began. Let me put that in simpler terms. Jesus existed long before He took on human form at Bethlehem. It is not easy for us to get our minds round that thought. It is not easy to understand or to put in to words the fact that Jesus, who was One with the Father before time began, could come as a baby born in a stable to a teenage mother. "The Word became flesh" defies all human understanding. At this moment our reason must bow to faith as our hearts bow in worship.

The second lesson we learn from verse 1 is that The Word was distinct from God: "The Word was with God." The language used by John speaks of a personal relationship between God the Father and God the Son. The Word existed in an eternal person-to-person relationship with God. A relationship of love and intimacy between the Father and the Son.

Thirdly, we read "and the Word was God." A better translation would be "and God was the Word." We recite this belief in the Nicene Creed even though it defies human definition or understanding.

Jesus is the Word of Life - He is the life giving Word active both in Creation and re-Creation. Verse 3 tells us that all things came in to being through Him, no exceptions. It was through Jesus, the Word, that God created the world. So God the Father and God the Son were both involved in the creation of the world. By implication John is telling us that this is God's world and we are but stewards of it. He follows this in verse 4 by pointing out that not only is the Word the mediator of Creation but is also active in re-creation. The Word became flesh in order to bring us, condemned to death because of the Fall, life - John 10.10. How do we come to life - John 20.31 - by believing on the Lord Jesus Christ.

The Light of God (verses 5) - have you ever experienced real darkness, not just night with no lights, but physical darkness in a cave or somewhere. You are quite literally lost, physically lost and are groping around trying to find a way ahead. John uses the imagery of light to depict the darkness that we live in due to sin. John uses the word "light" twenty-one times in his gospel, it is one of his keywords and images.

As the light of the world Jesus reveals the truth about God by His life, teaching, death, resurrection and ascension. Without Christ we remain in spiritual darkness as He alone is the true light, lighting the way to a right relationship with God.

Not only does Jesus reveal the truth about God but He also reveals the truth about us - we are walking in darkness.

The physical imagery around you this evening - the candles are all representation of the light of Christ winging in the darkness of this world. Even the tiniest flame from a candle lightens up the darkness around us. Did you notice that John uses the present tense "the light shines" and not the past tense? The light shines - it never goes out, it never grows dim and it never fades away. It shines as bright in the darkness of our day as it did that first Christmas morning in Bethlehem.

The last point - the darkness did not overcome it. What a truly awesome statement? What an amazing gift is offered to us this Christmas. A light that the darkness of our lives, of our family situations, of our world around us cannot extinguish and can never overcome. In a world of chaos, despair and desolation is it good news to know that there is a light that shines in that darkness and that the darkness cannot extinguish it? What a wonderful thing John has revealed to us here in these 5 verses.

So this Christmas, as we look out on this dark world and are path is lightened by a simple candle we remember with great thankfulness in our hearts that Jesus, who was before time began, humbled himself to take on flesh and to be born of the virgin Mary in a lowly castle shed in Bethlehem. He came to us in the darkness of this world and of our lives to shine a light that leads to God and which nothing, no one, and no darkness can ever put out. Our part is to accept that gift and become the children of God by faith in Christ Jesus.


