

Letter to Parishioners



Dear friends, please read: Matthew 5 verses 13-16 Here we are at the beginning of another year, 2025. No doubt some people have made New Year Resolutions - lose weight, go to the gym

be that you made yourself a promise last night, or even God a promise, that you would read the bible, pray and serve Him better in 2025 than 2024. Well, I want to challenge us all from God's Word to be 'Salt and Light Christians' in 2025 - beginning as individuals and then as a community of believers. Turn with me to our gospel reading - Matthew 5 verses 13-16. Four short verses which use everyday objects as a metaphor for our Christian lives.

Allow me to set the context for what Christ Jesus teaches in these verses to the people sitting on the Mount of Olives. If you look back at the beginning of the chapter you will see the Beatitudes. A list of 9 people and when you read them it seems impossible that such people could in any way influence the world in which they live. No doubt there were some listening that morning to Christ, maybe even amongst the disciples, who were thinking (or even saying to others) that it all sounded wonderful, even beautiful, but in the reality of everyday life, especially in a land under occupation by Rome, they were fanciful ideas that could not be lived out and certainly were not going to make a difference in the society of the day. It may be that you have had such thoughts, feelings or you may have even lamented that it seems Christians have no say or influence in the society in which we are called to live in today.

Just as a little aside - if you want the practical outworking and application of the Beatitudes read the book of James. Christ's half-brother puts

practical application on every one of the 9 Beatitudes as he writes his epistle.

Let us come back to our Gospel reading. So the context is the Mount of Olives, Jesus teaching His disciples and an assembly of people. He has given the foundation of all that He will say - the Beatitudes and now He starts to work them out in their lives.

Verse 13 - begins with a very emphatic 'You.' I can imagine Jesus making eye contact first with the disciples and then when those assembled in front of Him thought: 'Ah, this is only for the 12', Jesus slowly turns to them and catches their eye and points a finger and says: "You are the salt of the earth..." A common everyday substance that was of immense importance in the ancient near east. Salt was used not only to flavour food but to preserve food as well. It was used to clean and to purify all sorts of utensils and even rubbed on new born babies to protect them against bacteria. Pliny the Elder, who was a contemporary of Christ, said there was nothing more useful than salt and light - in Latin it reads 'Sale et Sole.'

So Salt has its every day uses in the ancient near east. It is a common household item, found in every home (no matter how poor), everyone would have been familiar with it, its taste and uses. It wasn't something extraordinary but a common everyday item. Remember that - Christ is saying it is common everyday life that makes the difference - not the extraordinary - because the truth is most of us live lives that are not extraordinary but mundane, even boring, every day common lives. We do and live ordinary lives and it is those every day ordinary lives that we are to be 'salt.' But How?

Please read carefully what I am writing now because I believe this is our calling as followers of Christ Jesus in the year ahead - both as individuals who love and follow Christ and together as the people of God in this

community. Salt - is used here to speak of your character, as depicted in verses 3-12 in the Beatitudes. This is serious business - look at the Beatitudes - is that a reflection of your character? It should be! If you want to be salt then those 9 Beatitudes should be seen in your life - not occasionally but every day, just like the use of salt.

Salt purifies - can that be said about you or about us as a congregation? When we are present are we means of purity in the conversation, in the behaviour, in the attitudes etc? You see salt stings, especially when it gets in to a wound. It stings and it does hurt but its purpose is to purify. It acts as a disinfectant to bring healing. Could that be said of you? Your words, your actions and attitudes towards people could it be said to bring about purity, cleansing and healing? That is quite a question is it not? Quite a challenge for us all. Are you a moral disinfectant in your home - by what you permit to be listened to, watched, brought in and the behaviour you condone, turn a blind eye to and approve of? Read the Words of Christ -'You are the salt of the heart, but if salt has lost its taste....no longer good for anything except to be thrown out and trampled under people's feet.' Have you lost your saltiness? Has your christian faith lost its flavour before your family and friends because you have lacked the courage to say 'No, much as I love you, this is not acceptable in my life, in my home etc?' I know it sounds harsh and I know it stings but that is because it is 'salt.'

Do you remember when you were on fire for God? Do you remember when you loved His Word, to sing His praise, to be with His people? What happened? Why now the apathy, the bitterness, the resentment of God's people and the preaching of God's Word - you lost your saltiness? Christ speaks plainly - it is of no use except to be thrown out and trampled underfoot. Let us be honest that is often how our witness, when we do have the courage to be salt, is treated by family, friends etc - Why because the rest of our lives has not 'salt' in evidence - we are no different than

they are and so why should they listen to our hypocritical moralising. Well, I have laboured that point long enough.

Verses 14-15 - Light. Twinkle, twinkle little star, How I wonder what you are? Ever been asked that because of your life? Again Christ begins with an emphatic 'You.' He says those who follow me, and none others, are the light of the world. The true Light of the World is Christ Jesus and as His people we reflect His light in our lives, through our lives and by our lives. Remember that your light is derived from Christ and not from within yourself. We are responsible for how visible it is but it is not something we create or produce ourselves. The only possibility of being light to the world is in a personal relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ. Light again symbolises purity as opposed to filth and error. It is the divine presence amongst His people which is reflected by and through His people to a dark and sinful world. The key function of light is for the benefits of others and not the light itself.

Look at verse 15 for a moment - you do not light a light and hide it. I wonder if after the crucifixion, resurrection and ascension did the disciples think about how they ran away and hid after His arrest in Gethsemane. I wonder as Matthew wrote these words did a pang of guilt pierce his heart and mind? Jesus says when you light a light and put it on a hill then all see it. It is fairly obvious, not easily hidden from the world around. Yet how many of you live hidden lives as Christians? Lighting a light and hiding it serves no purpose. Do you understand that this morning. Look at verse 16 - here is your purpose as light in this dark world. Not that you are to get the glory. Not that people are to commend you for your good works but that they glorify God your Father in heaven. The simple question arises, doesn't it, Do people know that your good deeds are for God's glory?

Two things arise there - do we actually do good deeds? Secondly, for whose glory do we do them? You see I am always suspicious when some

video clip arrives up on Facebook with guys leaving £100 tip in the McDonalds outlet. Whose glory is that for? Usually there is then 1000's of likes etc. You have had your reward says Christ - but it is better that such was done without the fanfare video to the glory of your Father who will reward you. There is a true balance to be achieved in this - the key is actually our hearts - which takes us right back again to the Beatitudes which are the context for this teaching.

The person or community that seeks to hide its allegiance to Christ has ceased to follow Christ. If you want to learn about the cost of following Christ let me recommend you read such books as Hiding Place by Corrie Ten Boom, Brother Andrew or Tortured for Christ or the biography of Helen Roosevere.

So, in closing this letter, accept in 2025 the responsibility placed on you by Christ, to be salt and light in this world. 'You...' emphatically speaking to you as an individual and to us all as His church at Holy Trinity Woodburn.

Salt and Light both affect their environment. They change everything they touch and come in to contact with. They do so by portraying God's purity, love and mercy. You cannot be salt or light by withdrawing from the world

Salt and light are every day common objects - seen and used by all. So you have no excuse this morning. You cannot claim I do not have any 'gift' or 'ability' because salt and light has nothing to do with 'giftedness' or 'ability' nor even 'calling' - they are both about your 'character' - about who you are and how you live. No one is excused in 2025.

So in 2025 - be salt and light. Be the people of God and live for His glory and His glory alone.
